Useful information

Madrid, capital of Spain, is a nice and safe city with a very exciting cultural diversity and a vibrant night life (for detailed touristic information and a list of touristic highlights and thing-to-do in Madrid, visit the office site www.esmadrid.com/en).

The currency is Euro €, though standard credit/debit cards are widely accepted.

Public transportation is reliable and useful. Taxis are identified by a red band on their sides. Buses are blue, and a single ride costs 1.5€. Metro ticket cost depends on distances. However, both Metro and buses accept travel cards. These cards can be bought in Metro stations (2.5€) and can be charged with 10 trips (7.3€). Several persons can use the same card, each tapping at the entrance.

Participants in the Assembly should come to Spain with a valid health insurance.

Citizens of EU countries can use the European Health Card.

The diplomatic network in Madrid comprises consulates of 122 different countries. Should you need to contact your consulate, check the information here.

Useful information

Language in Madrid is Spanish. However, basic English is fairly understood in stores and public services.

The mobile network is reliable and covers the 100% of the city. The network is fully compatible with any EU mobile. Participants from outside EU should contact their phone company to know the roaming fees for Spain.

The time in Spain is Central European Time, that is, GMT+1. Measures (time, weight, length, volume, temperature) all follow the international metric system.

Electricity is 220V (50 Hz), with power plugs type C and F (more information here).

Tipping is optional in Spain. If you have liked the service (at restaurants), you can add around 10% of the bill in cash.

The venue

The accomodation and the celebration of the 5th GNRC Assembly will take place in

Colegio Mayor Miguel Antonio Caro, Avenida Séneca 6, 28040 Madrid (link here)

It is situated near Moncloa Metro station (Line 6 and 3), less than 10 min walking. From Madrid Barajas International Airport, taxis offer a flat rate of 33€. They provide receipts upon request. There are also two Metro stations at the airport (Terminals 1-2-3 and Terminal 4, Line 8). A single ride costs 2€ + 3€ airport fee. In addition, one needs to buy a travel card (2.5€) that can be used afterwards.

The Residence has a small swimming pool. Bring with you a swimming suit and your sunscreen. The building has AC in lecture halls. All rooms have AC and a private bathroom.

Please remember that outside temperature in Madrid can be very hot (sometimes higher than 35°C). You should drink water regularly and avoid long periods in direct sunlight.

Cristina Inogés

A prominent theologian from Spain, Cristina Inogés is known for her insightful contributions to the dialogue on inclusivity within the Catholic Church. Her work focuses on bridging gaps and fostering understanding among diverse communities.





María Luisa Berzosa

Hailing from Spain, Sister María Luisa Berzosa is a dedicated pastoral leader and advocate for social justice. Her efforts in empowering marginalized groups have been recognized internationally.

Pope Francis appointed her one of three women consulters to the Synod of Bishops in 2019 and referred to her very affectionally as 'the flower of all the gardens', she is said to have had the ear of the former Pope Francis.

James Alison

James Alison is a renowned theologian whose work on reconciliation and truth-telling has inspired many. His sessions promise to offer deep insights into the spiritual journey of LGBTQ+ individuals. James is a theologian and openly gay priest. In 2017 he received a very unexpected call from Pope Francis who repeated several times that he had "the power of the keys". James understood this as Francis treating him as a priest with universal jurisdiction.





Renato Lings

Born in Denmark, and living in Spain, K. Renato Lings holds degrees in Spanish, translation studies and theology. In addition to studying Latin, Greek, Hebrew and Nahuatl (Aztec), he has written and taught extensively on biblical interpretation, translation, and issues relating to gender and sexuality.

Niurka Gibaja Yábar

Degree in Theology (UCA, El Salvador) and Master in Dogmatic Theology (U. Comillas, Spain), she is a cheerful, spiritual and activist woman. She has worked as a diversity coordinator with experience in training and support in LGBTI+ diversity, equality, and equity in the business field for the incorporation of trans talent into companies. She is part of the Women's Revolt group within the Church as well as CRISMHOM.





Arturo Retana Lobo

Microbiologist, philosopher and regional coordinator for Latin America of the GNRC. He founded the community <u>Espacio Seguro – Costa Rica</u> (Safe space – Costa Rica) in 2019. After three years as coordinator of this community, he leaves space for other people to take the leadership and gets involved in the GNRC (Global Network of Rainbow Catholics) as regional coordinator for Latin America.

Meli Barber

a US-based social worker and adjunct professor in the School of Social Work of the Indiana University (Indianapolis). She was also a Therapeutic Foster Care manager and recruiter in the agency Safy of Indiana and a director of religious education, youth and young adult ministry in Saint Anthony Catholic Church (Indicanapolis). She completed her bachelor and master studies in theology and philosophy in the University of Notre Dame (Indiana, USA) and a master of social work in Indiana University (Indianapolis).





Gonzalo Vilchis

Bachelor degree in business administration, master degree in accompaniment of couples and specialized in S. Ignatious spiritual exercises. He has collaborated from 2019 in the community *Sembrando Unidad en la Diversidad* and in REDCAM (Catholic Rainbow Network), both in Mexico.
